

Assignment 5: Tables, more elements

In this assignment, in each HTML page, we will create a big area called Jumbotron between the Navigation bar and the content, and we will apply styles to it. For our purpose, we will use the div element.

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A site about chocolate

We will See Some of the world's chocolates!

Things you didn't know about chocolate!

In the about.html page we will create and apply styles in a table.

Create your milk chocolate!
This recipe makes a bar of about 100g.

Ingredients	Quantity
Cocoa butter	50 g
Icing sugar	50 g
Milk powder (Full fat)	25 g
Cocoa powder (Unsweetened)	13 g

Also, we will add one more image.



Finally, we will move the images next to the text. We will do that using the float and clear properties.

HTML

In each HTML file, enclose the `<h1>` , `<h3>` elements inside `<div>... <div>` tags. In these divs add a class with name `jumbotron` which we will use for our CSS. For example, the `index.html` file should become:

```
<div class="jumbotron">
  <h1>A site about chocolate</h1>
  <h3>We will see some of the world's chocolates!</h3>
</div>
```

Don't forget the other HTML files! You may need the `<h3>` texts from the `about.html` and `contact.html`.

Open the `mystyles.css` and add the class `.jumbotron`

You can reproduce those shown below or add your own properties

<i>Cocoa powder (Unsweetended)</i>	<i>13 g</i>
